## PRISTINE BEACHES

You simply won't find prettier beaches in Michigan than right here in Ludington. Nothing feels better than spending a summer day at the beach! Our very own Stearns Park Beach has gained national attention for its sugar sand, lighthouse, concessions, restrooms, playground, skate park, mini golf, and grassy area. The beach area is so expansive that you never have trouble finding your own private spot, and parking is free! Three walkways lead from the sidewalk down to the shore, perfect for wheelchairs, strollers, or anyone who doesn't want to walk in the sand.

The Ludington State Park has two beaches the one on Lake Michigan features the Beach House and has exhibits, aquariums, tables, concessions, and a small store. At the Hamlin Lake beach, you'll find a new accessible playground plus a stand where you can rent canoes, kayaks, SUPs, and tubes. Even the road that leads to the state park has places where you can pull over, climb a small dune, and enjoy the refreshing waters of Lake Michigan.

Buttersville and Summit Parks south of Ludington also have beaches that allow dogs to swim in the water. •
